Electric Line Clearance Consultative Committee

This document outlines Energy Safe's positions on the Electric Line Clearance Consultative Committee's (ELCCC) proposed amendments to the *Electricity Safety (Electric Line Clearance) Regulations 2020* (Regulations), which includes the Code of Practice for Electric Line Clearance (Code), as presented by Energy Safe at the ELCCC meeting on 25 June 2024.

4(b)	Amendment to clause 4 to remove the requirement for a risk assessment in addition to the inspection by an arborist for applying the exception to minimum clearance space for structural branches around insulated LV electric lines.	Support.

There would also be consequential amendments to repeal clauses 6 and 7	We believe a further workshop is needed to ensure all relevant factors have been considered before supporting a reduction to 300mm.

10(b)	Amendment to regulation 10 to replace requirement to publish management plans on the internet with a requirement to provide a copy when requested to do so in writing.	Do not support. We believe publication of management plans provides transparency and accountability especially as not all management plans are required to be submitted to Energy Safe for approval. However, acknowledging the reasons for the proposal by the ELCCC, we commit to consulting on new guidelines for management plans following the remake of the Regulations and Code to address any residual concerns not addressed by the review of the prescribed contents that we have agreed to support.
